Areas of study that will help you be most successful when you sit for the RHDS credential include:

- Book of Style sections covering medical report formatting, turn-around times and grammar and punctuation
- Healthcare privacy and security standards
- Clinical medicine with emphasis on anatomy and physiology, medical conditions and diseases, diagnostic procedures to include imaging, labs, and classifications
- Surgical and medical treatments for medical conditions
- Health information technology to include computers
- Abbreviations and definitions that apply to healthcare documentation technology
- Abbreviations and definitions as they relate to transcription
